



STL CITY VOTERS: MAKE A PLAN TO VOTE

Information from the St. Louis Area Voter Protection Coalition

WHAT ARE MY CHOICES?

Starting Sept. 27:

You can vote absentee **in person** (with a qualifying ID) or **by mail** if you have a reason

Starting October 25:

Any voter with a qualifying ID can vote absentee in person, **no reason needed**

Election Day:

You can vote at your assigned polling place **OR** at a new Citywide Vote Center

WHAT ARE THE ACCEPTED REASONS FOR VOTING ABSENTEE?

You can vote absentee by mail or in person starting Sept. 27th if you expect you could be (**choose ONLY ONE reason**):

- Away from the City on Election Day
- Confined due to illness or disability or a caretaker for someone who lives at the same address (NO NOTARY REQUIRED for ballot return envelope signature)
- Working as a poll worker, first responder, health care worker, or law enforcement
- Have a religious conflict
- Incarcerated (but still eligible) (NO NOTARY REQUIRED for ballot return envelope signature)
- In a specific state-administered address confidentiality program

Voters with disabilities can request PERMANENT ABSENTEE STATUS by filling out a special application with their local election authority. These voters will automatically receive an absentee ballot **APPLICATION** before each election and must submit that application in order to get a ballot, but no notary will be required for the ballot return envelope.

WHERE CAN I VOTE ABSENTEE IN PERSON?

Starting Sept. 27th, you can vote absentee in person at the **City Election Board**, 300 N. Tucker (downtown) if you have a reason.

Starting October 25th, you can vote absentee in person **without having a reason**, & additional absentee voting sites will open at **Buder Library**, 4401 Hampton Ave; **Julia Davis Library**, 4415 Natural Bridge Ave; and **Schlafly Library**, 225 N Euclid Ave.

You will need to **show a qualifying ID** in order to vote absentee in person. The no-ID provisional ballot option is not available for absentee voting.

HOW DO I VOTE ABSENTEE BY MAIL?

APPLY as shown at bit.ly/cityabsentee at least 2 weeks before Election Day, but preferably earlier • **CAST** the ballot and place in postage paid envelope provided • **COMPLETE** the form on ballot envelope, including choosing ONE reason • **SIGN** the ballot envelope (in front of a notary if required). Don't obscure or mark out any information on the return envelope, because this information is needed to verify your ballot • **RETURN** your ballot by mail or in person to the City Election Board at 300 N. Tucker. A close relative can return your ballot for you if needed.

▶ MAKE YOUR ABSENTEE BY MAIL BALLOT COUNT!

Absentee by mail ballots can be **rejected** if the ballot return envelope is not filled out correctly or if it arrives after Election Day. Election authorities are **not required to notify voters** when their ballot has been rejected. **Make sure your ballot envelope is filled out correctly and sign the envelope in front of a notary public if required.** After returning your ballot, use ballot tracking options or call the election board to **make sure your ballot arrived & was accepted.**

ELECTION DAY VOTING: NOVEMBER 8, 2022

POLLING PLACES ARE OPEN 6am to 7pm on ELECTION DAY. You can vote at your assigned polling place (**MANY OF THEM HAVE CHANGED**) or at one of the new Citywide Vote Centers, where ANY City voter can cast a ballot. **Need a ride? Call APRI at 314-562-0411.**

WHAT KIND OF ID DO I NEED?

Voters must show ONE of the forms of ID set forth at ShowIt2Vote.com to vote **absentee in person** or a **regular ballot on Election Day.**

[YOU CAN USE AN EXPIRED QUALIFYING PHOTO ID AS LONG AS IT EXPIRED AFTER NOV. 3, 2020]

Voters who **do not have a qualifying ID** as shown at ShowIt2Vote.com can cast a **provisional ballot on Election Day** that a **bipartisan team** at the Election Board can validate via signature matching.
